Between 1912 and 1932, Dr. Booker T. Washington teamed up with Julius Rosenwald, president and CEO of Sears and Roebuck to construct more than 5,000 schools in 15 Southern states for Black children providing educational opportunities for thousands of students who may not have had access to formal education otherwise. All but two Alabama counties had Rosenwald Schools. Today, we have located less than two dozen of the 389 including New Hope School in Fredonia.

This presentation will provide information on the history of Rosenwald and Equalization Schools and provide details on some of the projects that have been preserved to date.
